<b>Apple</b>	Anna	15-25'	July	(Semi-Dwarf) Light greenish-yellow skin with slight red blush. Sweet, slightly tart, crisp, flavorful, creamy white flesh. Large fruit, stores well. Produces at an early age. Dorsett Golden, is useful as pollinizer to increase size and fruit production. <u>200 Chilling hours.</u> Available on M-111.
<b>Apple</b>	Dorsett Golden	15-25'	Mid June-Early July	(Semi-Dwarf) Outstanding, sweet apple for warm winter areas. Yellow skin with orange-red blush. Firm, smooth, crisp flesh with sweet-tart flavor. Very flavorful. Medium to large fruit. Good pollinizer for Anna apple. Developed from Golden Delicious. <u>Self-Fertile. 100 Chilling hours.</u> Available on M-111, and Common Apple Root.
<b>Apple</b>	Fuji	15-25'	September	(Semi-Dwarf) Reddish-green skin. Firm, crisp, juicy, white flesh fruit with excellent flavor. Medium fruit. A favorite fresh-eating apple. Excellent pollinizer for other apples. <u>Self-Fertile. 500 or less Chilling hours.</u> Available on M-111, and Common Apple Root.
<b>Apple</b>	Pink Lady	15-25'	Late Oct.	(Semi-Dwarf) From Western Australia. Very crisp, sweet tart, flavor. Reddish pink skin, over green when ripe. White flesh resists browning. <u>Self-Fertile. 300-400 Chilling hours.</u> Available on M-111.
<b>Apple</b>	Sundowner	12-20'	Oct.-Winter	(Semi-Dwarf) Sister of Pink Lady. Sweet, crispy, white flesh, with excellent flavor. Takes harsh growing conditions. <u>Self-Fertile. 200-300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on M-7.

<b>Apple</b>	3-in-1 Espaliered			Espaliered Combo. Anna x Dorsett Golden x Fuji - 3 apple varieties grafted onto one tree, and placed on 4 x 4 espalier trellis.
<b>Apricot</b>	Blenheim (Royal)	12-18'	Late June	(Semi-Dwarf) Medium to large, oval fruit. Yellow skin with orange cheeks. Freestone, sweet, aromatic, and flavorful apricot. #1 Apricot in California. Great fresh, canned, and dried. Early bloomer. <u>Self-Fertile. Less than 400 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Citation.
<b>Apricot</b>	Gold Kist	12-18'	Mid May	(Semi-Dwarf) Very heavy producer. Excellent sweet, tart flavor. Freestone. <u>Self-Fertile. 300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Citation.
<b>Aprum (Apricot-Plum hybrid)</b>	Cot-N-Candy	12-18'	Early to Mid July	(Semi-Dwarf) Extra sweet, white flesh. Very juicy with a plummy aftertaste. Average fruit size of 2-2 1/2". <u>Self-Fertile. Less than 400 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Citation.
<b>Aprum (Apricot-Plum hybrid)</b>	Flavor Delight	12-18'	Early June	(Semi-Dwarf) Sweet, bright yellow fruit. Resembles an apricot, but with a distinctive flavor and texture all of its own. 2" in diameter. Bigger yield if pollinated by another apricot. <u>300 or less Chilling hours.</u> Available on Citation.
<b>Cherry</b>	Minnie Royal	22-30'	Early May	(Standard) Medium-sized red cherry. Firm with good flavor. pollinizer for Royal Lee. Ripens 2 weeks ahead of Bing cherries. <u>200-300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Colt.
<b>Cherry</b>	Minnie Royal (Mini)	8'	Early May	(Mini) Same fruit as Minnie Royal, but on a dwarfing rootstock that only reaches 8 feet tall at maturity. Great for containers or small yard. pollinizer for Royal Lee. <u>200-300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on New Root 1.
<b>Cherry</b>	Royal Lee	22-30'	Late May	(Standard) Medium to large sized red cherry. Heart shaped fruit. Very firm with excellent flavor. Pollinated by Minnie Royal. <u>200-300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Colt.
<b>Cherry</b>	Royal Lee (Mini) 8'		Late May	(Mini) Same fruit as Royal Lee, but on a dwarfing rootstock that reaches only 8 feet at maturity. Great for containers or small yard. Pollinated by Minnie Royal. <u>200-300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on New Root 1.
<b>Fig</b>	Black Jack (Avail. In April)	15'	Aug-Oct	Delicious, medium sized strawberry red flesh. Skin starts green & maturing to purple when ripe. Use for canning, fresh eating or drying. <u>100 Chilling hours.</u>
<b>Fig</b>	Black Mission (Avail. In April)	25' x 40'	Aug-Oct	Strawberry red flesh. Purplish black skin. Use for canning, fresh eating or drying. <u>100 Chilling hours.</u>
<b>Fig</b>	Brown Turkey (Avail. In April)	15-25'	Lt. Spring & Lt. Summer	Medium sized fruits with light pink flesh. Purplish brown skin. Good flavor. Use for canning, fresh eating or drying. <u>100 Chilling hours.</u>
<b>Fig</b>	White Kadota (Avail. In April)	15'	Aug into Fall	White Fig (very pale green). Excellent flavor, and very sweet. Amber flesh with few seeds. Good for fresh eating, cooking, drying, and jams and jellies. <u>100 Chilling hours.</u>

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<b>Jujube</b>	General Instructions for all Jujubes	10-15'	Fall	Shiny, reddish brown, date like fruit. Sweet, apple flavor. Needs hot summers for fruit to ripen. Attractive silhouette producing clusters of yellow flowers. Nice decorative tree. <b>100-150 Chilling hours.</b>
<b>Jujube</b>	Contorted			(Standard) Round shaped. Reddish-brown when ripe. Eaten firm and crunchy off tree, or room-dried to date-like consistency. Partly self-fruitful, or pollinated by Lang. Branching structure is twisted and contorted.
<b>Jujube</b>	Lang			(Standard) Pear shaped, 1 1/2 inch long fruit. Ripens later than Li. Better to fully ripen on tree to full mahogany color for best flavor. More upright grower than Li.
<b>Jujube</b>	Li			(Standard) Round, plump, 1 1/2 inch long fruit. Shiny, reddish-brown, date-like fruit. Sweet apple flavor. Ripens earlier than Lang. Can be picked when yellow-green off tree, and will ripen off the tree. Partly self-fertile, or pollinated by Lang
<b>Jujube</b>	Sherwood			(Standard) Large shiny reddish-brown date like fruit. Sweet apple-like flavor. Upright grower with fewer thorns than other Jujubes.
<b>Mulberry</b>	Persian Fruiting	25-30'	Mid-Late Summer	(Morus nigra) (Standard) Large, heart-shaped leaves. Fruit resembles blackberry. Juicy, dark red to black fruit. Fairly drought tolerant once established.
<b>Mulberry</b>	Tea's Weeping	20' x 20'	Summer	(Morus alba 'Pendula) (Standard) Fast growing, heat loving tree. Fruit resembles blackberry. Fairly drought tolerant once established.
<b>Nectarplum (Nectarine-Plum Hybrid)</b>	Spicezee	8-14'	July/August	(Semi-Dwarf) Combination of nectarine and plum. Slightly acidic, white fleshed, and loaded with sugar to create a spicy/sweet flavor. Also beautiful as an ornamental tree, with dark red leaves in spring and lots of blooms. <u>Self-Fertile. 200-300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Citation

<b>Nectarine</b>	Panamint	15-25'	Late July	(Semi-Dwarf) Rich red skin, with golden-yellow flesh. Aromatic & intensely flavored. Medium to large fruit. Freestone. <b>250 Chilling hours.</b> Available on Nemaguard.
<b>Nectarine</b>	Snow Queen	8-14'	Late June	(Semi-Dwarf) Sweet, juicy, white, medium to large-sized fruit. Ripens 2-3 weeks ahead of Babcock Peach. Freestone. <b>250-300 Chilling hours.</b> Available on Citation.
<b>Nectarine</b>	Dwf. Necta Zee	6'	Mid-June to Early July	(Mini) Sweet, firm, flavorful, yellow freestone nectarine with red skin. Perfect for large containers or small backyards. <b>400 or less Chilling hours.</b> Available on Nemaguard.

<b>Peacotum</b>	Bella Gold	8-14'	Early July	(Semi-Dwarf) Peach x Apricot x Plum hybrid. Bright yellow skin with orange-red blush. Delightful rich tropical and apricot flavors. Semi-freestone. Pollinated by Flavor Grenade Pluot. <b>500 Chilling hours.</b> Available on Citation.
<b>Pear (Asian)</b>	20th Century	12-18'	Late July-Mid Aug.	(Standard) Thin, yellow-green skin. Firm, juicy, cream-white flesh. Good for fresh eating and canning. Crisp like an apple. Medium, round fruit. Heavy bearing. <u>Self-Fertile. 400 Chilling hours.</u> Available on OHxF333.
<b>Pear (Asian)</b>	Hosui	12-18'	August	(Standard) Brownish-orange russet skin. Juicy, sweet, flavorful, fine textured flesh. Crisp like an apple. Medium to large fruit. <u>Requires a pollinizer, such as 20th Century. 300-400 Chilling hours.</u> Available on OHxF333.

<b>Persimmon</b>	Chocolate	25' +	Mid-Oct.-Nov.	(Standard) Small to medium size, oblong, bright red skin. Sweet, spicy, firm, brown flesh, and superb flavor. Astringent until ripe (Hachiya style). Good pollinizer for Coffee Cake. <b>200 or less Chilling hours.</b> Available on D. Lotus.

<b>Persimmon</b>	Coffee Cake	25' +	Mid-Sept.-Mid-Oct.	(Standard) Unique spicy-sweet flavor of cinnamon pastry and coffee. Medium to large persimmon, almost round with orange skin, and orange flesh flecked with brown. Non-astringent, when eaten still firm. <u>Requires pollinizer like Chocolate. 200 or less Chilling hours.</u> Available on D. Lotus.
<b>Persimmon</b>	Fuyu 'Imoto'	25' +	November	(Standard) Large, round, flattened (more 'square' in shape than 'Jiro'). Great for fresh eating. Non-astringent. <u>Self-Fertile. 200 Chilling hours.</u> Available on D. Lotus.
<b>Persimmon</b>	Fuyu 'Jiro'	25' +	November	(Standard) Medium size, flattened shape fruit. Reddish orange skin. Great fresh eating. Heavy producer. Still hard when ripe. Non-astringent. <u>Self-Fertile. 200 Chilling hours.</u> Available on D. Lotus.
<b>Persimmon</b>	Giant Fuyu	25' +	November	(Standard) Very large fruit. Round to semi-oblong shape, with dark orange skin. Sweet and flavorful. Smooth texture. Non-astringent. <u>Self-Fertile. 200 Chilling hours.</u> Available on D. Lotus.
<b>Persimmon</b>	Hachiya	25' +	November	(Standard) Bright orange-red skin, covered with dark blotches. Sweet, rich excellent quality. Very large fruit. Oblong with a short point. <b>Pluerry</b>	Sweet Treat	15-25'	July	(Semi-Dwarf) Plum and cherry cross, combining the sweetness of a cherry, with the zing of a plum. Larger in size than a cherry, the fruit will stay on the tree for over a month. <u>Pollinizer required like Burgundy Plum. 450 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Myro 29C.
<b>Plum</b>	Burgundy	12-18'	Late July-Early Aug.	(Semi-Dwarf) Maroon-colored skin and flesh. Sweet flavor with little or no tartness. Small pit. Very productive red Japanese plum. Narrow, upright habit. <u>Self-Fertile. 300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Citation.
<b>Plum</b>	Green Gage (Bavay's)	15-25'	Mid July	(Semi-Dwarf) Round, medium, yellow green fruit. Firm, greenish-yellow flesh. Richly flavored, very sweet. <u>Self-Fertile. 600 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Myro 29C
<b>Plum</b>	Santa Rosa	12-18'	Mid June	(Semi-Dwarf) Purplish-red skin. Firm flesh, yellow to dark red near skin. Large, oval fruit. Rich, tart flavor. <u>Self-Fertile. 300 Chilling hours.</u> Available on Citation.

<b>Pluot</b>	Flavor King	12-18'	Mid-late August	<b>(Semi-Dwarf)</b> Plum-apricot hybrid. Reddish-purple skin. Sweet red flesh. Taste test winner. Remarkable, spicy bouquet and flavor. <b>Pomegranate</b>	Eversweet	8-10'	Late Summer-Fall	Very sweet, virtually seedless fruit. Red-thin skinned. Clear juice is non-staining. Showy orange flowers. Arching shrub. <u>150 Chilling hours.</u>
<b>Pomegranate</b>	Grenada (Avail. In April)	n/a	August	Large fruit. True grenadine selection. Dark, burgundy skin. Seeds and juice dark red, with good flavor. Ripens well in coastal & inland areas. <u>150-200 Chilling hours.</u>

<b>Pomegranate</b>	Wonderful	18'	September	Extra large fruit. Blushed red skin. Red rich flesh, juicy, with sharp flavor. Most well-known of pomegranates. <u>150 Chilling hours.</u>
<b>Pomegranate</b>	Angel Red (Tree)	18'	Mid-August	(Single Trunk) Heavy yielding fruit. Bright red in color. Extremely sweet and high juice content. Excellent for fresh eating with edible seeds that are soft enough to eat. Excellent for juicing. Uniform size and color. Ripens earlier than Wonderful. <u>150-200 Chilling hours.</u>
<b>Pomegranate</b>	Wonderful (Tree)	18'	September	(Single Trunk) Extra large fruit. Blushed red skin. Red rich flesh, juicy, with sharp flavor. Most well-known of pomegranates. <u>150 Chilling hours.</u>
<b>Ume (Flowering/ Fruiting Apricot)</b>	Shiro-Kaga	15-20'	Mid May	Attractive, showy single white blooms in late January to early February. Small fruit 3/4" to 1". Fruit mainly used for pickling in Japanese culture. Does well in mild winter areas. <u>Self-Fertile. 400 chilling hours.</u>
<b>Ume (Flowering/ Fruiting Apricot)</b>	Single Pink	15-20'	Mid May-Jun	Attractive, showy single pink blooms in January-Early February. Ripe fruit has red blush over orange skin. Fruit mainly used to pickling in Japanese culture. <u>Self-Fertile. 300-400 Chilling hours.</u>

### Specialty Combos

These trees are for mild climate areas. Enjoy different flavors all on one tree. Get longer fruit production. Space saver.

**Apple (4-in-1) Peach Zaiger Pride (5-in-1) Asian Pear (4-in-1) Plum (4-in-1) Pluot (3-in-1) Varieties vary on each combo tree.**

**Chilling Hours:** Refers to the number of hours, 45°F and under, during the dormancy period. These hours are cumulative and need not be continuous

All fruit and nut trees need a specific amount of chilling hours before they will produce fruit

**NOTES:** **Root Stalks:** Almost all fruit trees can be kept pruned under 8 feet tall with summer pruning. Rootstalks were chosen based on how well they establish in our soils. Fruit varieties in parenthesis are available on those rootstalks.

**Citation:** (Apricot, Aprum, NectaPlum, Nectarine, Peach, Peacotum, Plum, Pluot) Very tolerant of wet soils. Resists root-knot nematodes. Induces heavy bearing at a young age. Will keep peaches and nectarines dwarfed to 8-14 feet tall, and apricots and plums to 12-18 feet tall, if left unpruned

**Colt:** (Cherry) For sweet cherries. In heavy soils, trees are dwarfed to about 3/4 of their standard size, 22-30 feet if unpruned. Relatively tolerant of wet soil but good drainage is still required. Apparently resistant to bacterial canker. Trees begin bearing at young age

**D. Lotus:** (Persimmon) will grow to 12-25 feet tall, if unpruned.

**Lovell:** (Dwf. Nectarine, and Dwf Peach) Vigorous, more tolerant of wet soils than Nemaguard. When used on genetic dwarf trees, they stay around 6 feet

**M-7:** (Apple) Induces bearing at a young age. Resists fire blight and powdery mildew. 12-20 feet tall, if unpruned  
apple aphids and collar rot. 15-25 feet tall, if unpruned.

**M-111:** (Apple) Excellent all around rootstock for apples. Induces bearing at a young age. Tolerates wet, dry and poor soil conditions. Resists wooly  
apple aphids and collar rot. 15-25 feet tall, if unpruned.

**Mvrobolan 29C (Mvro 29C):** (Plum, Pluot) Shallow, but vigorous root system. Tolerates wet soils. Immune to root-knot nematodes, shows some  
resistance to oak-root fungus. 15-25 feet tall, if unpruned.

**Nemaguard:** (Almond, Nectarine, Dwf Peach) Vigorous, resistant to root-knot nematodes. Excellent rootstock for well-drained soils. In slower draining  
soils, plant on mound or birm. 15-25 feet tall, if unpruned.

**OHxF333:** (Asian Pear) Widely adapted, disease resistant. 12-18 feet tall if unpruned

**New Root 1:** (Cherry) New dwarf rootstock that will keep Cherries to 8 feet tall

	Misty	5' x 5'	Midsummer-Fall	Sky blue, medium large fruit. Pink & white bell-shaped flowers. Good for large tubs. Self-pollinating, but yields more when planted with other varieties. Full sun. Acidic soil. <b>300 Chilling hours.</b>
	O'Neal	5-6'	May	Large, firm fruit. Sweet & flavorful. Upright habit. Self-pollinating, but yields more with other varieties. Full sun. Acidic soil. Low chill, tolerates heat. <b>200 Chilling hours.</b>
